1 Thess. 5:11

The Underappreciated Gift: Encouragement

The animal shelter all started with one little bit of encouragement. But, before we get to that, let us start at the beginning of the story.

It all started with a teenage girl who had no idea what to do with her life. Her friends knew what they were going to do (lawyer, beautician, accountant), but in her senior year of high school she still had no idea. She took all of those tests that try to help you decide what to do with your life, but the tests all seemed to come up somewhat...well...general. "Do something outdoors."

In the girl's congregation was a member who was arranging the yearly "Blessing of the Animals." She needed someone who could help with the logistics of having dogs, cats, hamsters, fish, and one known pet goat in the church without any of them fighting or eating the others. The first person that the woman thought of to assist was the teenage girl. She lived just down the street, and the woman saw every day how she loved and cared for her pets. She knew the girl would be perfect.

And, that is how it all started. The teen helped with the animal blessing and it all went well.

"You know, you are really good working with animals. Have you ever

considered working with animals for a career? Of course, you are always welcome to help us," the church leader told the girl. The encouragement was exactly what the girl needed, and with it she decided that she would create an animal shelter as her way to serve God.

All of us are members of the body of Christ, and all of us have gifts given to us by God so that we might serve God and our neighbor. What not all of have is the knowledge of what those gifts might be. It often takes someone to invite us to work with them in order for us to realize exactly what our gifts and passions might be. Sometimes, it takes someone else to tell us what our gifts are before we are able to find our place in Christ's body.

This spiritual gift of looking at others and helping them see their potential is called "encouragement." It is an extremely underappreciated gift, but it is the one that helps individuals and communities move out of a sense of being tired and stuck in the faith and into actions that show love of God and love of neighbor.

As you go about your life in the faith, keep your eyes open for the gifts of others, and let them know. Give them the gift of encouragement.

A Closer Look at the Bible - Pastor Jira Albers

"12 For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 13 For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. 14 Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. 15 If the foot would say, Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body, 'that would not make it any less a part of the body. 16 And if the ear would say, Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body, 'that would not make it any less a part of the body. 17 If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? 18 But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. 19 If all were a single member, where would the body be? 20 As it is, there are many members, yet one body. 21 The eye cannot say to the hand, I have no need of you, 'nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you.'22 On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, 23 and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; 24 whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, 25 that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. 26 If one member suffers, all suffer together with it, if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.

27 Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. 28 And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. 29 Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? 30 Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? 31 But strive for the greater gifts." (NRSV, 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a)

1 Corinthians 13 will talk about how all Christians should strive together toward the greater gift of "love" that all share. But, before we get to that, the apostles Paul and Sosthenes (the writers of the letter) want to focus a little bit on the body of Christ and how it functions. The Corinthian church has begun quarreling over interpersonal conflict and ethical dilemmas. The Corinthian church seems to have tried to work out these situations by individuals claiming power and authority in various ways. Rather than choose a "king" or "queen" who is right and everyone else is wrong, Paul and Sosthenes take a different approach. They focus on the group's unity. And they do this through an analogy of the body.

"The body" (soma in Greek) can refer either to our actual bodies (the ones we were born with) or to a group of people (think the "body politic"). This double understanding of body, which is similar in English, serves to be very useful to Paul and Sosthenes' argument.

They argue that the Spirit has joined everyone through baptism into one body. All are included in the body and are important, no matter your background. Paul and Sosthenes then give a simple example to emphasize who is included in the body: "Jews or Greeks, slaves or free." This list is not intended to be exhaustive, but serves as a springboard into thinking about who is included in this body by the Spirit. Both people of the covenant (Jews) and the people grafted in (Gentiles) are included by God. Whether you are owned by someone (slave) or own and direct your own body (free), you are equal in this body drawn together by the Spirit. Some Christians have expanded on this list to emphasize current realities, "Liberal and conservative, rich and poor, educated and uneducated." Though this is not strictly biblical in that these categories are not listed, it is in the same spirit of Paul and Sosthenes' understanding.

Of course, though we are in one body, we are not the same. We are equally in the body, but we do not all have the same gifts. This should seem obvious, but remember that people exclude themselves (or others) if they feel as if they do not fit in the group because they are different (14-16). People also tend to emphasize the important of their own gifts and passions and tend not to take seriously those gifts and passions for which they do not care as much (21). In fact, those members of the body that seem weaker (think fingers) are essential and those members that seem dirty and inferior (think sexual organs) we clothe greater (22). Paul and Sosthenes want to emphasize that we are all different with different gifts. No one is the same, nor do we all have the same gifts. In addition, those who appear to be of lesser importance are, in fact, given greater attention. We do not cast away those in the group who seem inferior. Quite the opposite; we hold onto them tighter.

But, how is this body ultimately arranged? Is it hierarchical with Christ as the head and most important? No. The body is Christ (27) and each member of the body is just as important as any other. Instead of quarreling over small things, the body should focus on the greater gift: love (1 Cor. 12:31-13).
