### Pastor's Message



### **Becoming an Invitational Congregation**



A Message From Pastor Jira Albers

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Here is the reality of the American church situation: it is in decline. This is no big secret. We can see it ourselves when we look around the sanctuary, but I think that it just needs to be stated.

The second reality is that this decline is, for the most part, not our fault. The peace immediately following World War II led to a boom of babies. That boom in babies led to the necessity of the nation's infrastructure to grow. Schools were built. Neighborhoods were created. Churches expanded and added large educational wings. Following generations of the church population, however, did not produce those great numbers of children, and our church's populations started to shrink again. If fact, the church's population has been shrinking since 1950 when it topped out.

So, here we are; left with a smaller congregation and fewer resources. So, what do we do? This has been studied extensively, and we actually know what we need to do. We have known for quite a while. Individual members of congregations need to pray, need to invite, and need to clear out anything from the church (sometimes literal clutter) that gets in the way of someone

new getting to know Jesus Christ.

Here is the thing: the traditional church population may have decreased, but there are certainly plenty of people who are not followers of Jesus (or are followers, but have not connected with a church). Though the decline is not our fault, failing to faithfully invite others to Christ is our fault. Put bluntly, the death of the church institution is not our fault, but allowing it to continue to die is something that we choose to do. Many congregations have an idea of what they need to do in order to share Jesus with their neighbors, but they refuse to make the changes needed to actually do it. They actually choose to die.

It does not need to be this way. If we want to "make disciples of all nations," then we will pray for guidance about how to do just that, each member will intentionally invite other people within their lives to worship, Bible study, and serving Jesus, and we will not be afraid to make the changes needed to make all of that happen.

We are choosing to be an invitational congregation. We are choosing to make disciples. We are choosing to be the people of God. Jesus will lead us.

### The Question Box

(Questions About Our Christian Life)

What is the biggest challenge to people joining our church?"

The biggest challenge to people joining our church, of course, is being invited in the first place. Taking someone out for breakfast (or lunch) and attending worship together is an easy step to get us started in being invitational. But, the biggest hindrance to keeping new people in the congregation is intentionally getting to know new people, and then actually caring about them. When talking to people who do not join, their answer usually has to do with not connecting with others and someone being mean to them. — Pastor Jira Albers

### A Closer Look at the Bible - Pastor Jira Albers

### Even You Can Lead a Bible Study!

This time around, I want to challenge you to lead a Bible study. Really, I mean it. Gather together one or two other people. They can be friends. They can be other members of the church (this would probably be the easiest for a first time). Get together at church or in your home and simply follow the instructions for the Bible Study. Your only rules as the leader are to *not* offer the "right" answer and to leave plenty of silence for people to answer. I really, actually want you to try it this month. Go!

### **Guide For Bible Study**

Share one joy you've had from the week.

Share one sorrow that you've had from the week.

Have participants relax and simply listen at first. Carefully and slowly read a Bible selection through twice.

What one word or image captures your attention? Why?

Read the Bible selection again, or invite a volunteer to read.

What does this reading say about human nature?

Read the Bible selection again, or invite a volunteer to read.

What does God care about according to this reading?

Read the Bible selection again, or invite a volunteer to read.

What is God saying to God's community through this reading?

Read the Bible selection again, or invite a volunteer to read.

How does this reading speak to you? What are you taking away from this Bible study?

Close with a prayer of thanks to God for the insights brought through God's encounter with you.

# SYNOD NEWS

### Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA

### Mission Trip to Puerto Rico



Imagine riding in one of two fifteen-passenger vans, both navigating a narrow two-lane road that twisted and turned up into the tropical mountains of central Puerto Rico. The views were spectacular. Palms, giant philodendron, and the fiery flowers of the Flamboyant Royal Poinciana tree grace the roadsides and green mountain walls. Small, compact, and humble homes supported by what looks like toothpick legs hug the steep slopes. A morning journey brought the volunteers to the town of Comerío, where the streets have yielded to the mountain's natural topography, reminiscent of the hilly streets of San Francisco.

On June 30, 2019, under the guiding eye of Lutheran Disaster Response working through Lutheran Social Services of Puerto Rico, 25 Lutheran volunteers from 5 Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod churches traveled to Puerto Rico to repair homes damaged by Hurricane Maria.

The volunteers divided into four teams. One team repaired a house needing to have the roof power washed and sealed, as well as its interior ceiling and walls scraped and painted. This house had stood empty for the past two years and was unlivable in its current state. The family who had lived there pre-Maria were hoping to return to their nome as soon as possible.

Thanks to God and the excellent guidance and organization of Lutheran Social Services of Puerto Rico, the team was able to power wash their roof and seal it. They scraped ceilings and painted the interior of their home. Much

of their nearly new furniture, now moldy and warped, still awaited removal. All their kitchen appliances had been destroyed.

And yet, because of the hard work of the team, and a generous grant from The Witness and Service Ministry Team supported through Mission Support giving to the Synod, the work was accomplished. Donations of various gift cards from a number of congregations enabled the team to burchase a new refrigerator for the family. What a joy to see faces of hope as these homeowners came so much closer to reclaiming their home. Iruly the team used its hands to do God's work!

There have been several phishing attempts recently that appear to be emails from Bishop Zeiser asking for "help." Two were phony Gmail addresses (bishopnepsynod@gmail.com and rzeiserbishopr@gmail.com). Neither the bishop nor any of the synod staff will ever email you directly asking for "help." This is a scam. Please don't reply; even better, just delete the email without even opening it.

### Parish Secretaries' Christmas Luncheon



On December 10 the fourth annual Parish Secretaries' Christmas Luncheon was hosted by the Synod's Support Staff at The Lutheran Center in Schoenersville. This year the luncheon was opened to all lay workers in the congregations of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod. There were 45 people in attendance. After greetings from Bishop Zeiser, a hot, catered lunch was served, introductions were made, and there was time for some get-to-know-you games and plenty of fellowship.

The luncheon always has some return guests and some first-time attendees. This year there was a parish secretary who

was in her sixth week of church work, and one who has been serving in the church for 50 years. Pastor Laura Csellak went above and beyond by driving two secretaries from Ashland in Schuylkill County to The Lutheran Center so they could be a part of the festivities. The cost of the luncheon was subsidized with Thrivent Action Team grants.

About 45% of the staff members who attended were treated by their congregations and/or pastors. Let's try to increase that percentage next year and encourage congregation workers to take advantage of a fun, relaxing afternoon in the middle of the Advent season. It's a wonderful opportunity to build partnerships with other church workers and the synod. Look for a keep-the-date card with next year's date at the synod assembly.
