## Pastor's Message



### **Created Out Of The Scraps**



A Message From Pastor Jira Albers

"We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose."

I knew of an early teen that lived in a town that was undergoing a huge housing boom. Houses were being built left and right. And, one of the benefits for a young woodworker living in such a town was that there were dumpsters on the curbs full of boards that were two foot long or less. To the builders of the houses. these boards were useless hunks of wood, but to a budding carpenter they were like gold. He would scavenge the small hunks of wood, take them home, and add them to a growing collection. What was he going to do with all of those short pieces of wood? He did not know. What he did know was that the pieces of wood were not scrap. He would figure out something to build with the wood. Thus, birdhouses, toys, storage boxes, clocks, and many other small wonders were created out of the scraps.

That is the difference between someone who builds things and a creative carpenter. Someone who builds things uses a plan that has been drawn up clearly and goes and buys the most pristine wood needed to build the project. There is nothing wrong with this. Beautiful buildings, furniture, and other works are made in this way. However, the creative

carpenter, though he/she too is capable of building from plans, is more energized by having a pile of scraps and imagining what work of beauty could possibly be made out of such a pile of misfit pieces.

Jesus was a carpenter. I sometimes think about how well his trade suited his ministry of good news. He was not just a builder of things, though he most certainly could create things out of perfect raw materials. More than a builder, Jesus is a truly creative carpenter. Jesus takes imperfect people, people who have been thrown away or cast aside, and fashions them into a beautiful work for the purpose of his wonders. When he looks at us, broken people as we are, he does not decide that our destiny is simply for the trash. Instead, he looks at us and decides what he can create with the scraps that we are.

If Jesus can redeem a poor scrap of wood like me individually, imagine what he can do with a bunch of us put together! Jesus' church has been created out of scraps to be a beautiful representation of his own heart. It is not perfect. But, at its best, it is a beautiful creation of love for the sake of love. We are not just any scraps after-all, we are God's scraps.

#### The Question Box

(Questions About Our Christian Life)

"I was told that the phrase 'descended into hell' from the Creed is not biblical. What do you think?"

Those who question the biblical basis for the phrase "descended into hell" as stated in the Apostle's Creed are on good footing. You would be hard pressed to find a place where the Bible says that Jesus descended into "hell;" the place of eternal punishment. By the eighth century, the Apostles' Creed included the Latin phrase "descendit ad inferna," which literally means 'he went down to the spirits of the lower regions.' The Latin phrase is more akin to the idea of "Hades" which was not a place of eternal torture, but just a place of the dead. When "descended into hell," is used, people are really meaning, "descended to the dead" (which is the ecumenical phrasing used by many churches today.) In the Creed we are declaring that Jesus died a true death. For without a true death there cannot be a true resurrection. – Pastor Jira Albers

## SYNOD NEWS

#### Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA

### Lutheran-Episcopal Shared Ministry



Installation of Council at St. John, Sayre with Pr. Melinda M. Artman

St. John, Sayre was without a pastor; and the Congregation Council realized that the operating budget could not support a full time clergy person. A little more than two years ago, the neighboring Episcopal Church (Church of the Redeemer: 'Redeemer') reached the same conclusion and approached St. John's about sharing a clergy person. Both churches had a history of sharing in ministry with one another, and this seemed like a wonderful opportunity to do more together while maintaining their respective and distinct identities.

Both Lutheran and Episcopal churches are few and far between in the northern tier of the synod. So with the help of Pastor Peter Kuritz, Associate of the Bishop, and Canon Anne Kitch of the Episcopal Diocese of Bethlehem, a general outline of what the parishes wanted from clergy was developed. Pastor Kuritz and Canon Kitch then worked together to hammer out a call process that respected both traditions. Each parish was willing to have either a Lutheran or an Episcopalian as the pastor; so a Call Committee was formed from both parishes, and a notice went out last summer of a vacancy.

Pastor Artman saw the notice. Her work in helping two Episcopal parishes through the merger process in Southern Maryland was coming to an end, and serving in two great reformed traditions greatly appealed to her.

Working collaboratively with small congregations in discerning how to be the church in the 21st Century was also an attractive challenge to Pastor Artman. With a prior career in city and regional planning she thought that she had a skill set that would help both parishes grow into their full stature in Christ. So she applied. Interviews began in November and concluded in January. It is not typical for an Episcopal priest to be the only candidate presented to a parish, nor to have "an audition" before the entire congregation. Redeemer agreed to have only one candidate at a time presented. However its governing body made the decision to extend a call, and the congregation was not made aware of the selection until after St. John's made its decision.

In early January, both parishes extended a call to Pastor Artman, and three weeks later she accepted. On April 1 she began her new ministry. In late May, she will be joined by her wife, two dogs, and a cat in a new home somewhere in or near Sayre.
